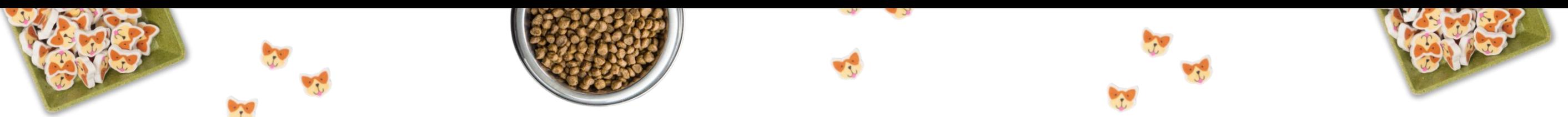

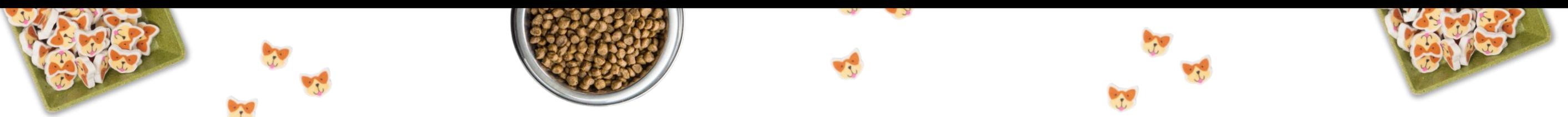

Clue #3: Detective Report

There were $5 + 6 = 11$ animals in the pet shop. Today, $2 + 1 = 3$ dogs were adopted by families. $4 + 4 = 8$ cats were also adopted. However, when the manager was making sure every pet was in their crate for the night, he realized $11 - 7 = 4$ rabbits were missing! He checked all over the store, including $8 + 7 = 15$ rabbit cages. When he couldn't find them, he called $3 + 7 = 10$ workers to help him search. Everyone looked for the missing rabbits and found $1 + 5 = 6$ of them hiding behind the fish tanks. They found $14 + 3 = 17$ more hiding in the snake cages. As the night passed, only $4 + 12 = 16$ more rabbits were found. But in the morning, $4 \div 3 = 1$ little kids found the other rabbits hiding near the dog cages.

They all decided to adopt them.
