You and your best friend are finally at summer camp, but now, you don't know where your friend went. It's up to you to solve a set of clues to figure out where they are and solve the mystery!

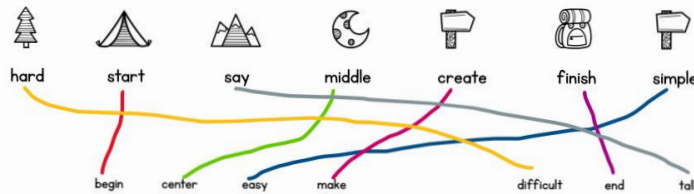
1. Take a map of locations and then start solving each clue.

WHAT MAKES READING MYSTERIES UNIQUE?


Reading Mysteries aren't just a copy of Math Mysteries!


